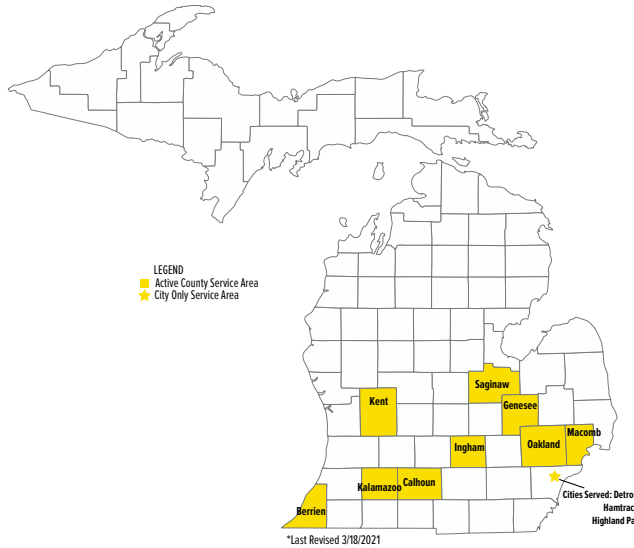

## Proven Results

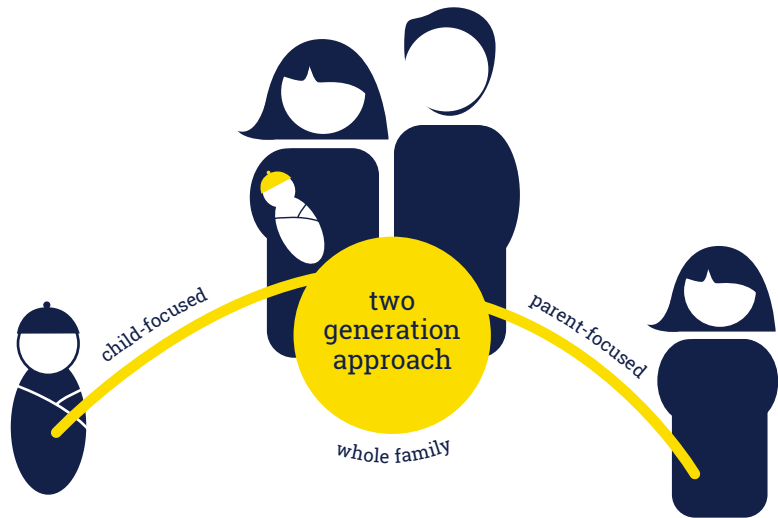
