61% OF CLIENTS 18+ WERE EMPLOYED AT 24 MONTHS

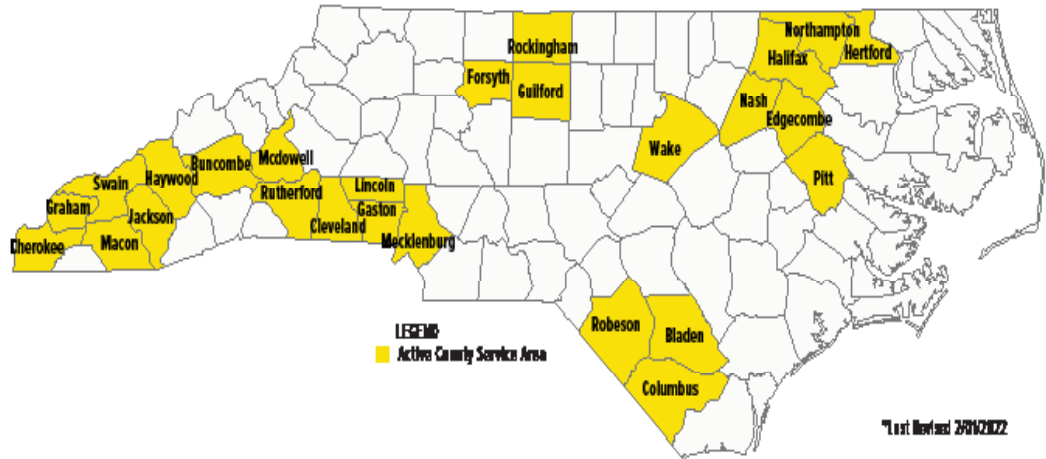
