In Puerto Rico, we are making history with our first-ever Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) Network Partner, Goodwill de Puerto Rico. This groundbreaking initiative managed in partnership with Goodwill of Central & Southern Indiana, will bring vital nurse-led home visiting services to first-time mothers on the island. For the first time, Puerto Rican families will have access to the proven support of NFP, helping mothers nurture healthier pregnancies and stronger futures for their babies.

In North Carolina, we are expanding Child First's reach into 17 additional counties, ensuring that more children and families facing adversity receive the critical mental health and early intervention services they deserve. With state-awarded contracts and the support of local partners, we are helping more families break cycles of trauma and build pathways to stability. ## PROGRAMS WITH PROVEN RESULTS

Because of your generosity, Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP) and Child First continue to demonstrate powerful, research-backed outcomes that change lives. According to the latest U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Home Visiting Evidence of Effectiveness (HomVEE) review, NFP achieved 112 statistically significant favorable outcomes—the most of any of the HHS-Approved Home Visiting Models—leading in areas such as child development, maternal health, family self-sufficiency, and reductions in child maltreatment.

At the same time, Child First continues to show a profound impact, achieving 27 statistically significant favorable outcomes, particularly in linking families to critical services, improving maternal health, and child development and school readiness. By providing intensive, home-based interventions for young children and families facing adversity, Child First helps mitigate the effects of trauma and promotes long-term resilience. These results highlight the profound impact of home visiting programs—and they are only possible because of you. Your support ensures that families receive the evidence-based care they need.
